STEP 3: On reverse page, select desired trees and/or shrubs and fill in quantity and dollar amount

STEP 4: On reverse page, calculate sum in *TOTAL PRICE* column and also in *SUBTOTAL FROM TREE & SHRUB ORDER* section. On this page, place subtotal amount in *SUBTOTAL from Tree & Shrub Order*

STEP 5: On this page, choose appropriate Ground Cover Items needed and fill out *SUBTOTAL from Ground Cover Items*

STEP 6: Sum subtotals into *SUBTOTAL TOTAL*

STEP 7: Add 6% Sales Tax

STEP 8: Put final payment number into *TOTAL AMOUNT DUE*

STEP 9: Mail payment with application to the CCNRD

STEP 10: Pick-up trees and/or shrubs from CCNRD just in time for spring!

Thank you for your interest in the Crook County Natural Resource District tree sales program.

Sales from the trees and shrubs help fund CCNRD conservation projects throughout Crook County. The Wyoming Association of Conservation Districts Tree Program enables farmers, ranchers and other landowners to obtain trees at nominal cost. The purpose of the program is to encourage landowners to plant effective wind barriers to protect buildings, cropland and feedlots and for erosion control, conservation practices, reforestation, and Christmas tree plantings. The CCNRD tries to provide trees acclimated to Crook County; however, each species may have limited adaptability to local soil types and conditions; if you are interested in ordering trees that are not on the list, please feel free to call or email the CCNRD and we will try to assist in any way we can. Please complete the form entirely, in a legible manner.

SEEDLING TREES

1. Farmstead protection requires 3 or more rows of shrubs and trees. Field protection can be obtained with 1-3 rows of shrubs and trees with proper design and protection.
2. Spacing between rows should be at least 4 feet wider than the cultivation equipment to be used, usually 12' to 16' for irrigated land and 20' for dry land.
3. Spacing in the rows varies with the species. For small to medium shrubs - 2' to 4', tall shrubs - 4' to 6', small to medium trees - 8' to 10', medium to tall trees - 10' to 14', pines and spruce - 12' to 14', and junipers - 6' to 8'. A tight row of deciduous shrubs on the windward side is desirable to trap snow in the windbreak.
4. The land should be cultivated and fallowed in the fall prior to planting the windbreak. Weed control of the planting is a must operation to maintain survival.
5. For lasting performance, better protection and greater aesthetic value, two or more rows should be evergreen species.

PLAN BEFORE YOU PLANT: A planting plan should be prepared before trees are ordered or planted. The planting plan should illustrate the proper location for the planting, the best species for your site, spacing between trees, spacing between rows, and the correct number of woody vegetation needed. The plan should also provide requirements for proper planting to gain initial survival and how to keep trees in a vigorous growing condition. For planting plan assistance, please feel free to contact the CCNRD or Natural Resources Conservation Service to help provide information on tree planting and maintenance care.
